Title: Being Informed with Data Science --

Engineering as a Use Case for Research in Data Management and

Analytics?

Abstract

Data Science has been perceived as the next great wave that will wash ashore great scientific discoveries. However, this hype has grown unrealistic expectations from some domain experts. At the same time, elementary and at the same time fundamental questions within Data Science, from different perspectives, continue to be unsolved. These include the proper inclusion of domain knowledge into data-science processes (aka. "theory-guided data science"), issues related to data quality, and important open points regarding the evaluation of data-science methods. This talk will feature respective research activities of KIT-IPD, both finished and envisioned ones. The talk will include references to engineering (or better: the speaker's layman perspective on engineering, which the audience will then be invited to correct and extend).
